April 2011 promises to be a rewarding month for Pro Helvetia New Delhi. Seventeen Indian arts practitioners, including three critics, will be in Switzerland to further intensify an exchange which is now in its fifth year.

Indian artists Paribartana Mohanty, Srishti Rana and Sreejata Roy will be in Switzerland on the Artist-in-Residence programme at PROGR, Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts and iaab, respectively.

The following eleven individuals (musicians et al) from India have been invited to Geneva to participate in Electron India 2011: Avinash Kumar and Gaurav Malaker of BLOT, DJ Hamza, Manu Idhra, Latif Khan, Udyan Sagar (Nucleya), Ritnika Nayan - publisher of the book HUB, Amit Saigal - Global Groove, Rea Krishnatraye, Shilpika Bordoloi and Gilles Chuyen. This collaboration is a result of an earlier project supported by Pro Helvetia New Delhi - when Jerome Soudan of MIMETIC was presented by Pro Helvetia at Global Groove, the first electronic music festival & convention in India in December 2009, supported by the Goethe Institut.

Seasoned journalists S Kalidas, Associate Editor India Today, Aveek Kumar Sen, Senior Assistant Editor The Telegraph and Baradwaj Rangan, Deputy Editor The Hindu will be in Zürich on the invitation of Museum Rietberg to attend the opening of the exhibition, The Way of the Master – The Great Artists of India, 1100–1900.
